1. What is the main theme of a Christmas story? Provide an example. (2 marks)

2. Describe the setting of a Christmas story. What makes it festive? (2 marks)

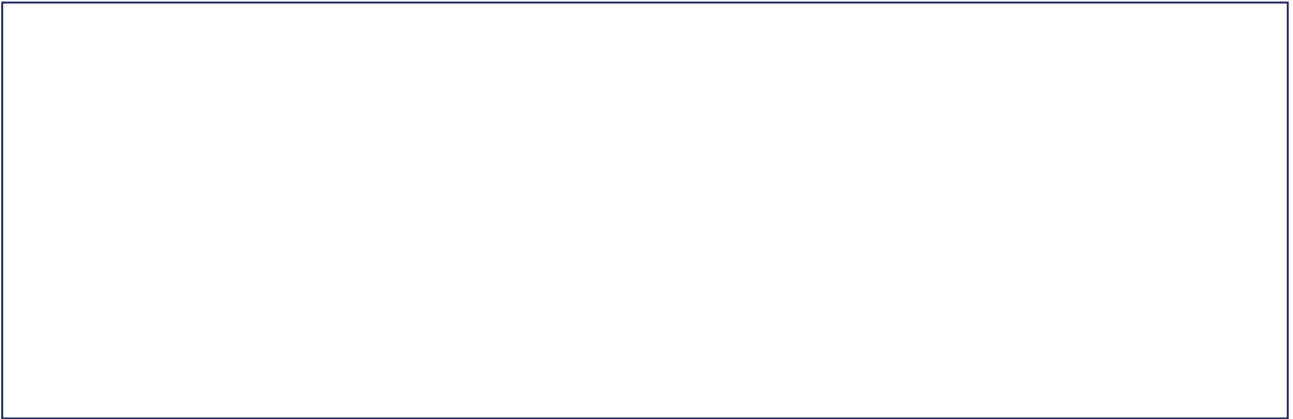
3. What is the role of a main character in a Christmas story? Give a brief example from a Christmas book you have read. (2 marks)

4. How do authors use descriptive language to create a festive atmosphere in a Christmas story? (2 marks)

5. Compare and contrast two Christmas stories you have read. What are the similarities and differences? (4 marks)

6. Explain the importance of the title of a Christmas story. Give an example and explain why it suits the story. (3 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of your favourite Christmas character. Include details about their appearance, expression, and accessories.
