

A Time of Renewal: The Story of Easter

Learning objective: To develop reading comprehension skills by retrieving information, making inferences, and justifying opinions regarding the historical and cultural significance of Easter.

1. According to the text, why does the date of Easter change every year? (2 marks)

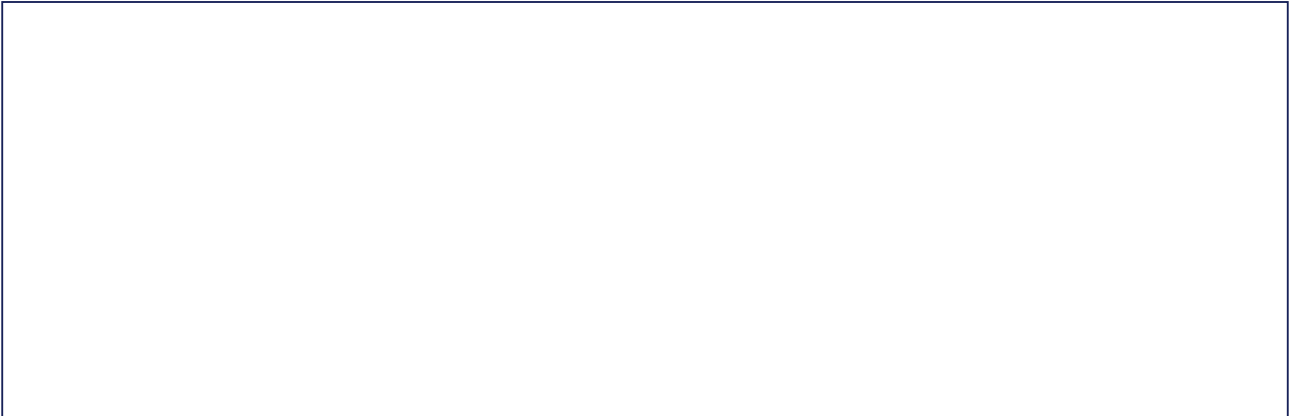
2. Name two symbols mentioned in the passage that represent new life. (2 marks)
