3. Why do newspaper reports use direct speech? Give an example from the text. (3 marks)

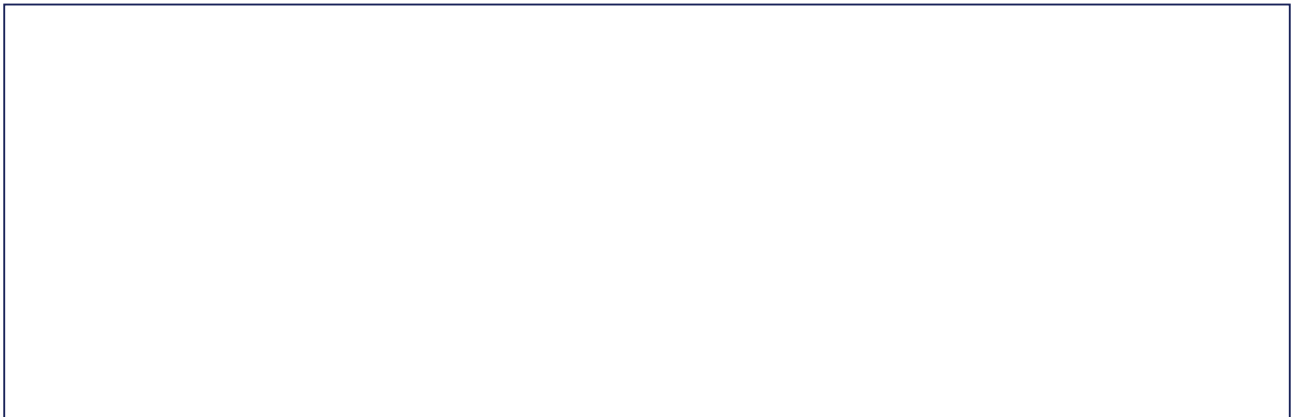
4. Look at the sentence: 'Local families enjoyed a picnic on the grass.' Change this sentence into the past progressive tense. (2 marks)

5. Find and copy one adverb from the text that describes how an action was performed. (1 mark)

6. Explain why the tone of a newspaper report should be formal rather than informal. (4 marks)

7. Writing Task: Imagine Max the Monkey has just discovered a giant golden banana in the park. Write a short newspaper report (approx. 50-75 words) including a catchy headline, the 5Ws, and one piece of direct speech from Max. (10 marks)
