

Nouns and Verbs Adventure

Learning objective: To understand the difference between nouns and verbs in a sentence and identify examples in a text.

Read the passage about Pip's adventure and answer the questions. Use the word bank to help you.

Pip the caterpillar was on a big adventure. She went to the library to read some new books. When she arrived, she asked the librarian about exciting stories. Pip loved eating the delicious treats in the café and watching the colourful butterflies. After a busy day, she decided to go home and take a nap.

1. What is the main action in the sentence 'Pip went to the library'? Mark the verb. (1 mark)

2. What type of noun is 'books'? Check the word bank for help. (1 mark)

3. What is a verb that describes an action Pip did in the café? (1 mark)

4. What type of noun is 'adventure'? (1 mark)

5. Describe a time when you went on an adventure. What actions did you do? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Pip on her adventure. Include at least two nouns and two verbs in your picture.



Extension challenge: Write your own story about Pip's next adventure. Make sure to include a variety of nouns and verbs.
