- **Why do poets use personification?** By giving human qualities to non-human things, like saying 'the wind whispered secrets,' poets make their writing feel alive and relatable.
- **What is the power of a metaphor?** A metaphor describes one thing as if it were another to create a vivid picture in the reader's mind, such as 'the sky was a velvet blanket.'
- **Why choose alliteration?** By repeating the same starting sounds in nearby words, like 'the bubbling brook,' poets create a musical quality that is fun to read aloud.
