Learning objective: To practise spelling rules and common exception words for Year 4 students, including prefixes and homophones.

Read the front of the card to test your spelling knowledge. Use Kit the Fox's clues to help you remember the tricky parts! Flip the card to check your answer.

Spell the word that means 'to vanish from sight'. Hint: It uses the prefix 'dis-'.	Spell the word that means 'to appear again'. Hint: It uses the prefix 're-'.
disappear	reappear
If you are feeling tired of doing the same thing, are you 'bored' or 'board'?	I write on this at the front of the classroom. Is it a 'bored' or a 'board'?
bored	board
Spell the word for a set of dates showing the days, weeks, and months of the year.	Spell the word that starts with a silent 'k' and means facts or information.
calendar	knowledge
Spell the word that means something you own. Hint: It has four 's' letters!	Which prefix can you add to 'lead' to mean 'to give the wrong idea'?
possession	mislead
Spell the word for a substance used to treat an illness or injury.	What is the term for two words that sound the same but have different meanings and spellings?
medicine	homophone
Kit the Fox says: How do you spell the word that means to be in a state of 'being' plus 'cause'? (Hint: because)	Spell the word that describes a group of people who are close together in one place.
