

The Great Storytelling Challenge with Ellie the Elephant

Learning objective: To identify and analyse features of narrative structure, character development, and descriptive language in stories.

Read the short story excerpt below. Use your knowledge of narrative structure and literary devices to answer the following questions. Remember to use your best handwriting!

Ellie the Elephant stood at the edge of the Whispering Woods. The ancient trees swayed, their leaves shimmering like silver coins in the moonlight. 'I must find the lost library of legends,' she whispered, her trunk twitching with excitement. Suddenly, a mysterious shadow darted across the mossy path. Ellie took a deep breath and stepped forward into the unknown. The adventure had finally begun.

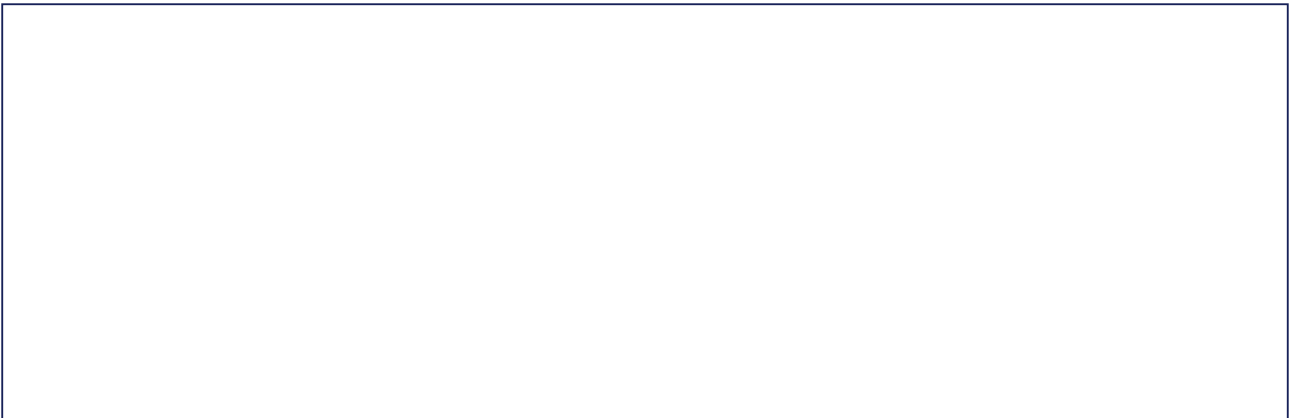
7. 7. What is the 'plot' of a story? (1 mark)

Write a short paragraph (4-6 sentences) describing what Ellie finds inside the library. 5. If you were the author, how would you change the setting to make the story feel more dangerous? 6. Analyse how the author builds tension in the final two sentences.
