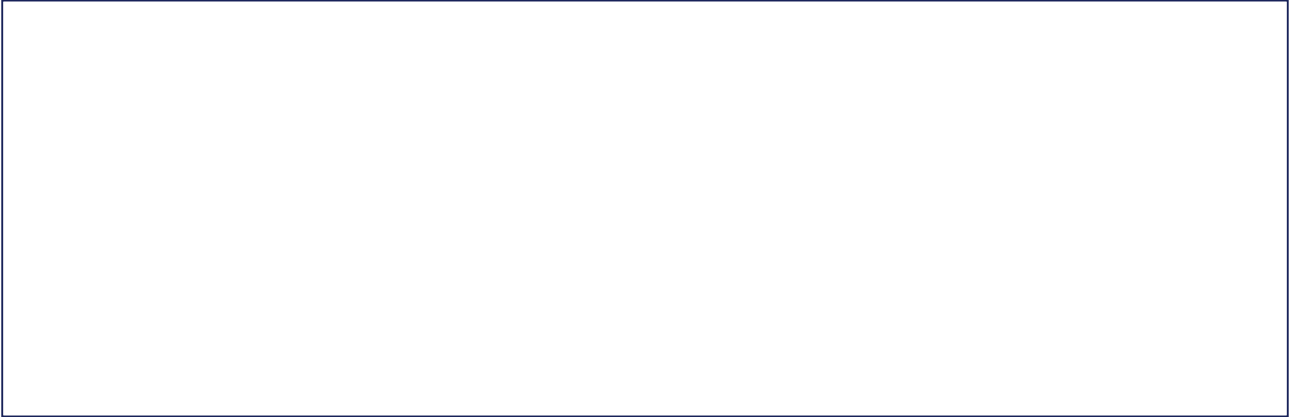
7. 7. Give a synonym for the word 'Enormous'. (1 mark)
