

Year 4 French Assessment: Sharing Opinions

Learning objective: To express personal preferences and opinions about activities and food in French.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you spell your answers correctly. Write your responses in the spaces provided.

Rosa the parrot is visiting a French primary school today! She is asking the pupils about what they enjoy. Some children love sports, while others prefer eating snacks or reading books. Rosa wants to make sure everyone can explain not just what they like, but why they like it.

1. Translate the following phrase into English: 'J'adore le chocolat'. (2 marks)

2. Rosa asks: 'Aimes-tu le football?' Write a French sentence to say that you do NOT like football. (2 marks)

3. Match the following French phrases to their English meanings: 1. J'aime, 2. Je déteste. (Write the number next to the English phrase). ____ I hate. ____ I like. (2 marks)

4. Fill in the blank using the word bank to complete this opinion: 'J'aime la pizza _____ c'est délicieux.' (2 marks)

5. Why is it important to use 'parce que' when giving an opinion? Explain your answer in English. (4 marks)

6. Rosa wants to know your opinion. Write a short paragraph in French (at least 3 sentences) describing two things you like and one thing you dislike. You must use 'parce que' at least once to explain your reason. (8 marks)

7. If a friend says 'Je déteste la lecture', what is a polite way to ask them 'Why?' in French? (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of yourself sharing a snack with Rosa the parrot. Label the snack in French (e.g., 'le chocolat' or 'la pomme').
