1. 1. I am the longest river in Africa, flowing north towards the Mediterranean Sea. Which feature am I? (1 mark)

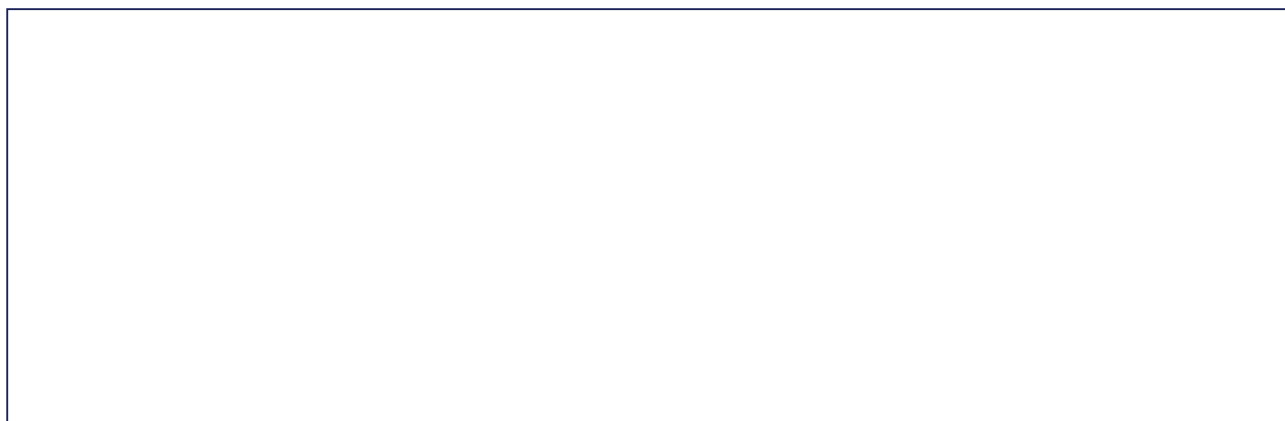
2. 2. I am the largest hot desert in the world, covering much of Northern Africa. Which feature am I? (1 mark)

3. 3. I am the highest mountain in Africa, located in Tanzania. Which feature am I? (1 mark)

4. 4. I am an imaginary line that runs around the middle of the Earth. Africa is split by me. Which feature am I? (1 mark)

5. 5. Explain why the Savanna is an important biome for African wildlife. Use full sentences. (2 marks)
