3. Climate Zones: What is the weather like in different parts of Europe? Start with: 'Due to its large size, Europe experiences several different climate types, including...' (2 marks)

4. Human Geography: What do people do in Europe? Think about major cities, languages, or landmarks. Start with: 'Many people live in Europe's vibrant cities, where they...' (3 marks)

5. Fun Fact: What is one interesting thing you have discovered about a specific European country? Start with: 'An interesting fact about [Country Name] is that...' (2 marks)
