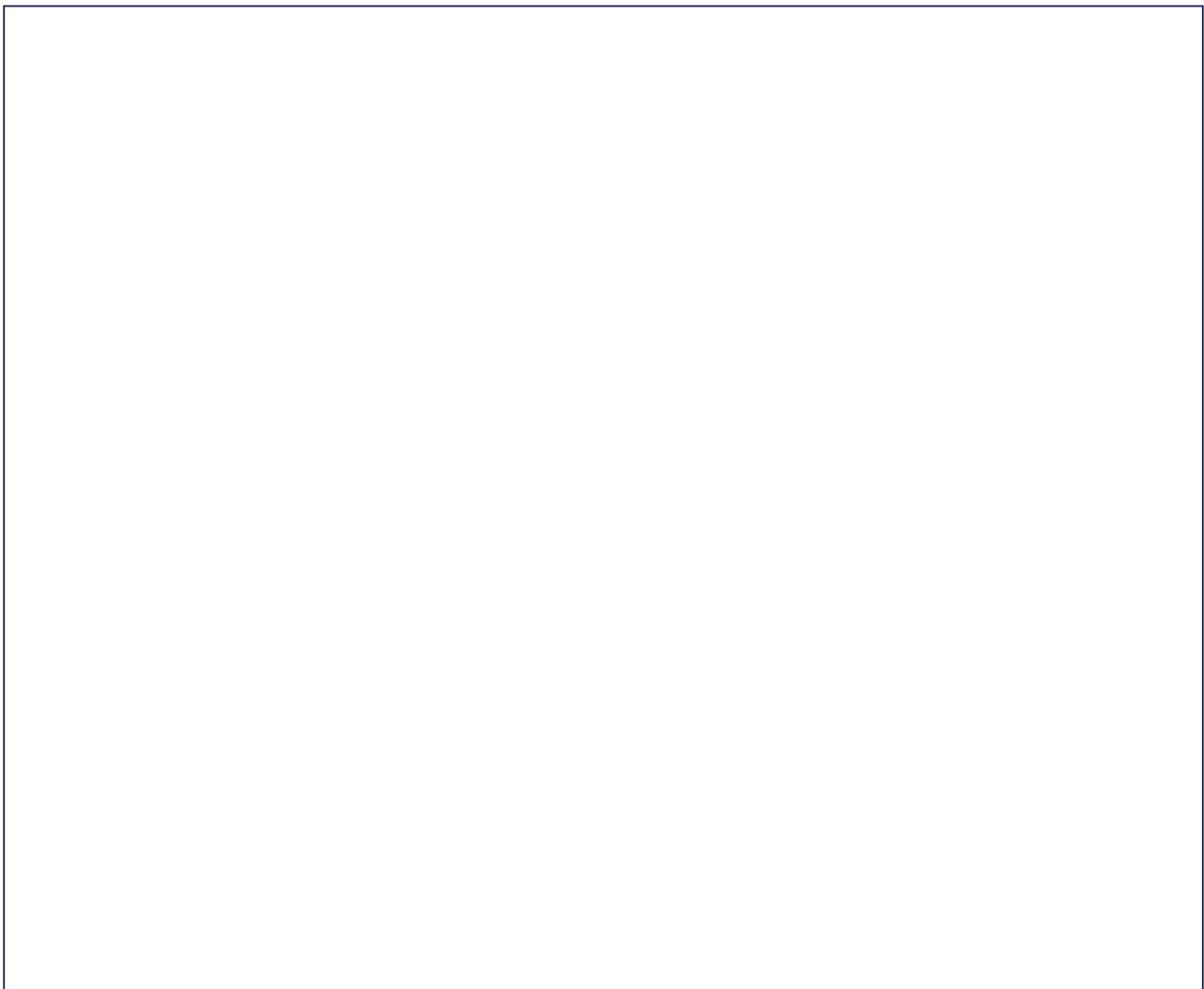


Florence Nightingale: The Lady with the Lamp

Learning objective: To understand the historical significance of Florence Nightingale and identify the key objects she used during her work in the Crimean War.

Use your knowledge of Florence Nightingale to complete the drawing below. Add labels to show you understand why these items were important for the soldiers' health and recovery.

Draw: Create a scene inside a Crimean War hospital ward. The style should be clear and descriptive, similar to a historical illustration. Include Florence Nightingale in the middle, holding a lantern. Surround her with rows of beds and add details like clean bandages on a side table and fresh sheets on the beds to show how she improved hygiene. Use pencils or felt-tips to show the contrast between the dark night and the warm light of her lamp.



Label words: Lamp · Bandages · Medicine · Clean linen · Hospital ward · Florence Nightingale

Steps:

1. Draw Florence Nightingale holding her famous lamp in the centre of your page. Make sure she is wearing her 19th-century nurse's uniform.
2. Around Florence, draw three things that helped make the hospital a cleaner and safer place for the soldiers.
3. Why was the lamp so important for Florence when she visited the soldiers at night? Explain in your own

words.

4. Label your drawing using at least four words from the word bank provided.

5. Ellie the elephant remembers that Florence was known for her kindness. Draw a small speech bubble coming from Florence with a kind message she might have said to a soldier.
