

Moon Mission: A Day with Neil Armstrong

Learning objective: To understand the significance of the 1969 Moon landing and identify key features of the Apollo 11 mission.

Follow the drawing prompts below to create your own historical scene. Use the word bank to add labels to your masterpiece.

Draw: Create a detailed scene showing the Moon landing. Use a charcoal or grey pencil to shade the Moon's surface, showing bumpy craters and footprints. Draw a large, circular Earth in the corner of the sky using blue and white colours. Ensure the astronaut is drawn with a large, reflective helmet.



Label words: Eagle Lunar Module · Crater · Astronaut · Space Suit · Moon Surface · Earth · Flag

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw Neil Armstrong standing on the dusty, grey surface of the Moon. Make sure he is wearing his protective space suit.
2. Step 2: Draw the 'Eagle' Lunar Module nearby. Label the craft using the word bank.
3. Step 3: Draw the Earth in the dark sky above the Moon's surface. What colour should the Earth be?
4. Step 4: Draw a flag planted in the lunar dust. Why do you think he placed a flag there?
5. Step 5: Label at least three items in your drawing using the provided word bank.
