Master the Volume: Let's Make Some Noise!

- **Dynamics** refer to the different levels of volume in a piece of music, ranging from very quiet to very loud.
- The marking 'p' stands for piano, which is a direction to play softly.
- The marking 'f' stands for forte, which is a direction to play loudly and boldly.
- A **crescendo** is a musical instruction for the sound to gradually get louder over time.
- A **diminuendo** is a musical instruction for the sound to gradually get quieter over time.
- **Composers** use dynamics to add emotion and excitement to their music, helping to tell a story through sound.

Did you know? Did you know? The word 'piano' actually comes from the Italian term 'piano e forte', which means 'soft and loud'. Even though we call the instrument a piano, its full original name was 'pianoforte' because it was the first keyboard instrument that could play both soft and loud notes depending on how hard the keys were pressed!
