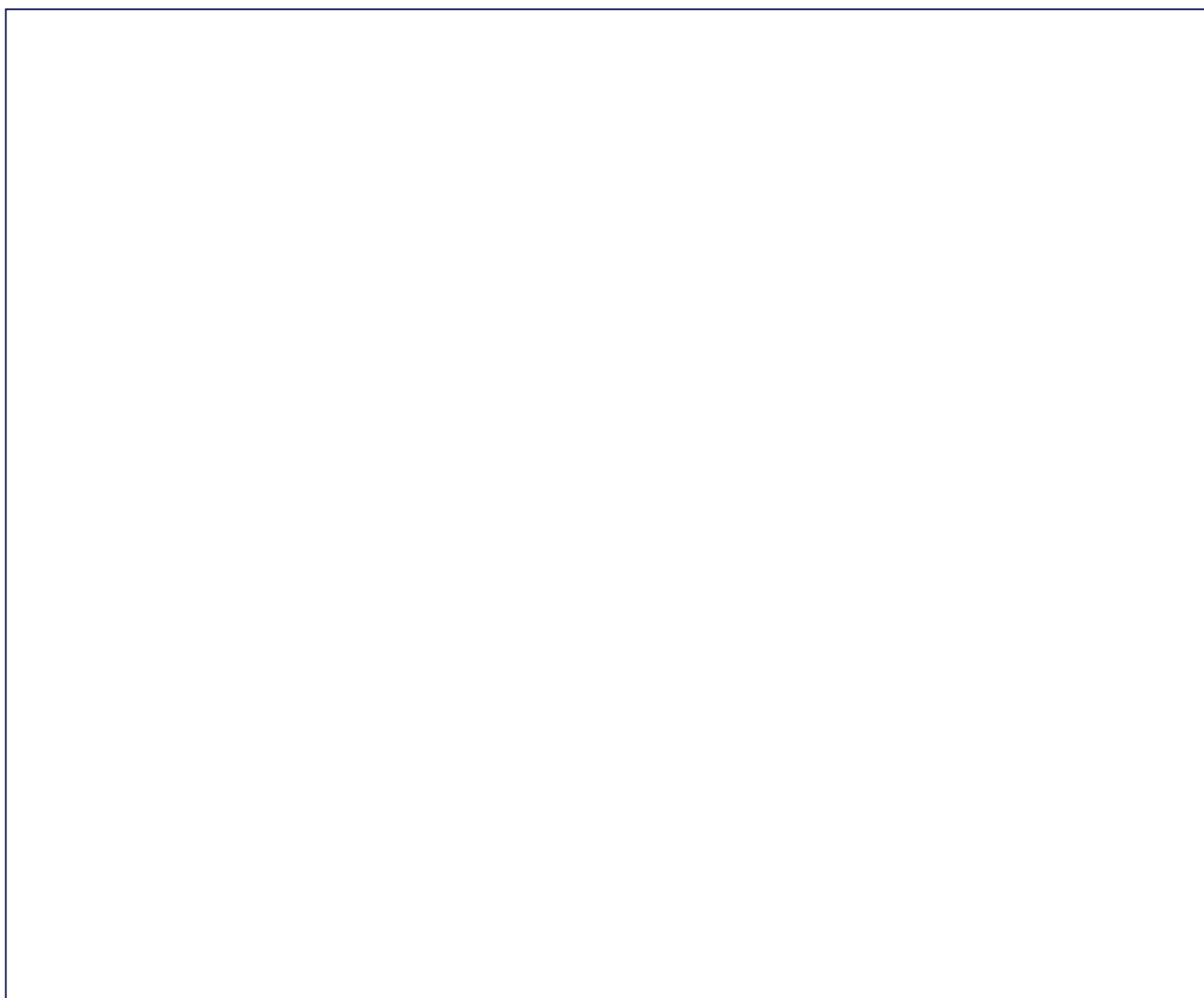


Max's Musical Notation Challenge

Learning objective: To understand and represent musical notation by drawing notes on a stave.

Follow the steps below to complete your musical score. Use the word bank to help you label your drawing accurately.

Draw: Create a clear, neat musical score on your page. Draw a standard five-line stave horizontally across the middle. Use a sharp pencil to draw a large, elegant Treble clef at the start. On the lines and spaces of the stave, draw your musical notes clearly: a solid-headed crotchet, an open-headed minim, and a quaver with a flag. Add a vertical bar line through the centre of the stave to divide your work. You may draw Max the monkey sitting next to the stave, holding a conductor's baton.



Label words: Treble clef · Stave · Minim · Crotchet · Quaver · Bar line

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a 5-line stave in the centre of your page. Label the five lines.
2. Step 2: Draw a Treble clef at the beginning of your stave.
3. Step 3: Draw a crotchet (worth 1 beat) on the second line from the bottom (the G line).
4. Step 4: Draw a minim (worth 2 beats) in the third space up.
5. Step 5: Draw a bar line to separate your notes into two different bars.
