

Building Bridges of Friendship

Learning objective: To identify the qualities that make a good friend and understand how to maintain positive relationships.

Use your creativity to design a 'Friendship Garden'. Think about the qualities that help a friendship grow, like trust and kindness, and represent them as flowers, trees, or garden features in your drawing. Use the word bank to help you label your creation.

Draw: Draw a vibrant 'Friendship Garden'. In the centre, draw a large, colourful tree representing 'Trust'. Around the tree, draw different flowers and plants to represent other qualities from the word bank (e.g., a 'Kindness' daisy or a 'Laughter' bush). Include a small path leading into the garden to show that friends are welcome. Use bright colours and clear labels to explain what each part of your garden represents.



Label words: Kindness · Trust · Listening · Sharing · Honesty · Support · Respect · Laughter

Steps:

1. List two qualities from the word bank that you think are most important for a healthy friendship and explain why.
2. Max the monkey is having a disagreement with a friend about which game to play. What is one fair way they could solve this problem?

3. How can you show support to a friend who is feeling sad or worried?
4. Why is it important to listen to your friend's point of view even if you disagree with them?
5. Label your drawing with three qualities from the word bank that you have included as parts of your garden.
