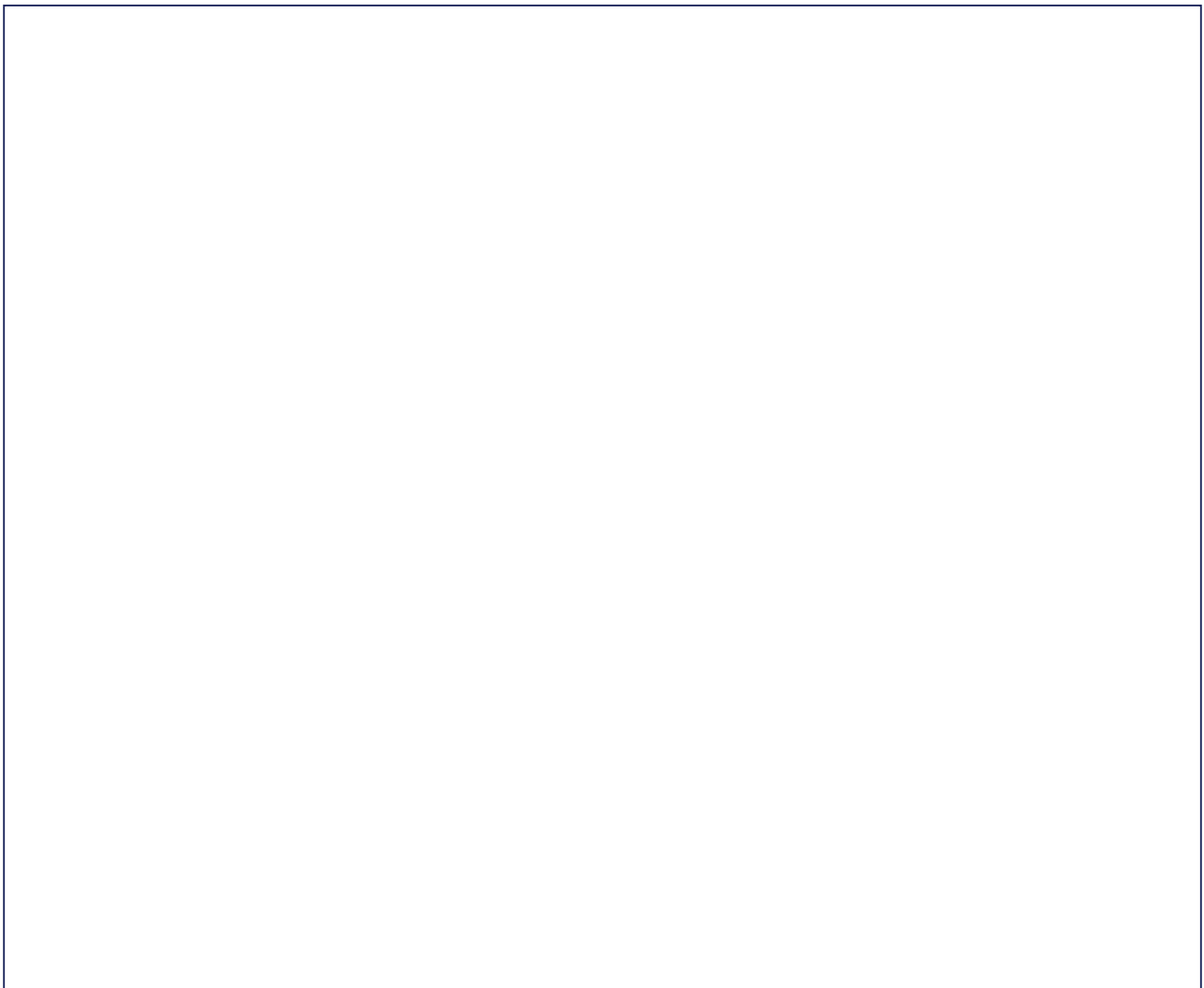


Celebrating Festivals Around the World

Learning objective: To identify and represent the key symbols, colours, and traditions associated with different religious and cultural festivals.

Max the monkey is helping us explore how people celebrate special days! In the large space provided, create a vibrant collage drawing that shows different festivals. You can draw a scene from one specific festival or a 'festival map' showing several different celebrations. Use the word bank to label your drawings and follow the steps to complete your masterpiece.

Draw: A large, open landscape or circular 'celebration wheel' where the student can illustrate various cultural and religious symbols. The style should be bright and inclusive, encouraging the use of patterns, light effects (glows), and diverse groups of people celebrating together.



Label words: Diwali · Eid · Christmas · Hanukkah · Lanterns · Lights · Family · Feasting · Prayer · Gifts

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a symbol of light (such as a diya lamp, a candle, or a lantern) used in a festival. Label it using the word bank.
2. Step 2: Draw a special food or a feast that people might share during a celebration. Label what the food is.
3. Step 3: Draw people gathering together. How can you show they are celebrating? (Think about their

clothes or expressions).

4. Step 4: Use bright colours to decorate the background. Which colours represent joy and celebration in your drawing?

5. Step 5: Label one way that your drawing shows a festival is a 'special' time compared to a normal day.

6. Step 6: Choose one festival from the word bank and draw a specific tradition associated with it (e.g., a greeting or a decoration).
