- **Diwali** is known as the Festival of Lights, where lamps called diyas are lit to symbolise the victory of light over darkness.
- **Eid al-Fitr** is a joyful celebration that marks the end of Ramadan, a month of fasting, prayer, and giving to those in need.
- **Christmas** is celebrated by Christians to commemorate the birth of Jesus, often involving giving gifts and gathering with family.
- **Hanukkah** is the Jewish Festival of Lights, where a nine-branched candelabra called a menorah is lit over eight nights.
- **Lunar New Year** is celebrated in many East Asian cultures with dragon dances and red envelopes to bring luck and prosperity.
- **Vaisakhi** is a harvest festival celebrated by Sikhs and Hindus, often featuring colourful parades and dancing.

Did you know? Did you know? Some festivals follow the lunar calendar, which is based on the cycles of the moon, meaning the date they are celebrated changes slightly every year!
