

The Moral Compass Challenge with Leo the Lion

Learning objective: To explore moral dilemmas and understand the difference between 'right' and 'wrong' choices in everyday situations.

Leo the Lion has found a series of 'Moral Dilemmas'. For each scenario, decide whether the action is 'Right' or 'Wrong'. Then, explain why you chose that answer and suggest a better way to handle the situation if the action was wrong.

Word bank: Honesty · Kindness · Fairness · Responsibility · Empathy · Respect

1. Scenario 1: Sarah finds a £2 coin on the playground. She knows it belongs to her friend, but she decides to keep it to buy a treat from the shop. Is this right or wrong? Why? (2 marks)

2. Scenario 2: Tom sees a new student sitting alone and looking sad at lunchtime. He invites them to come and play a game with his friends. Is this right or wrong? Why? (2 marks)

3. Scenario 3: Maya accidentally breaks a vase while playing indoors. When her parents ask what happened, she tells them the cat did it so she doesn't get in trouble. Is this right or wrong? Why? (2 marks)

4. Scenario 4: During a football match, James notices the other team made a mistake that gave his team a goal. He tells the referee the truth, even though it means his team might lose. Is this right or wrong? Why? (2 marks)

5. Scenario 5: Lily is told to help tidy up the classroom, but she pretends to be busy so that someone else has to do all the hard work. Is this right or wrong? Why? (2 marks)

6. Scenario 6: Oscar sees someone being unkind to a classmate. Instead of joining in, he tells a teacher and asks the classmate if they are okay. Is this right or wrong? Why? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Leo the Lion helping a friend make a kind and honest choice.



Extension challenge: Think of your own moral dilemma. Write the scenario down and explain what the 'most moral' choice would be and which word from the word bank describes that choice.
