

Remembrance Day: A Tribute of Peace

Learning objective: To understand the significance of Remembrance Day and identify key symbols used to show respect and reflection.

Use this sheet to create a respectful scene for Remembrance Day. Follow the steps below to build your drawing, then use the word bank to label your work. Think about why these symbols are important to people across the UK.

Draw: Draw a respectful and peaceful scene. Start by sketching a large, vibrant red poppy as the main focus. Add a wreath made of smaller poppies at the bottom of the page. In the background, draw a gentle sunrise or a silhouette of a memorial statue. Use a soft, calm colour palette. You may add extra details like birds flying or a quiet field. The style should be reflective and thoughtful, like a mural or a poster for a ceremony.



Label words: Poppy · Wreath · Medal · Silence · Reflection · Armistice

Steps:

1. Why do people wear a red poppy on their clothes during the month of November?
2. What does a two-minute silence represent to people observing Remembrance Day?
3. Step 1: Draw a large poppy in the centre of your page. Label the petals and the stem.
4. Step 2: Add a wreath of flowers at the base of your poppy. Label it using the word bank.

5. Step 3: Write one word on your page that describes how you feel when you think about peace.
