

Rosa's Spanish Body Parts Challenge

Learning objective: To identify and name parts of the body in Spanish and understand how to use them in simple sentences.

Read the passage below about Rosa the parrot. Use the word bank to help you complete the questions that follow. Good luck, or as Rosa says, '¡Buena suerte!'

Hola! I am Rosa. I am a colourful parrot who loves to travel. When I fly through the sky, I use my wings, but when I am on the ground, I look at my own body to learn new words. I have la cabeza with two small eyes, los ojos. I use la boca to sing my favourite Spanish songs. I do not have arms, but humans have los brazos and las manos to wave hello. I stand on my two legs, las piernas, and my feet, los pies. Can you help me label my friends?

Word bank: la cabeza (head) · los ojos (eyes) · la nariz (nose) · la boca (mouth) · los brazos (arms) · las manos (hands) · las piernas (legs) · los pies (feet)

1. Rosa uses her mouth to sing. What is the Spanish word for 'mouth'? (1 mark)

2. If you wanted to describe your two feet in Spanish, what would you say? (1 mark)

3. Rosa says that humans have two things that help them wave hello. Write down the Spanish words for 'arms' and 'hands'. (2 marks)

4. Look at the word 'la cabeza'. Based on the passage, what part of the body does this refer to? (1 mark)

5. Why do you think Rosa uses her 'ojos' while she is flying? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a friendly stick figure. Label the head, nose, hands, and legs using the correct Spanish words from the word bank.



Extension challenge: Try to write a short sentence in Spanish using one of the body parts. For example: 'Tengo dos ojos' (I have two eyes).
