

¡Qué Ropa! - Rosa's Spanish Wardrobe

Step into the wardrobe with Rosa the parrot and discover how to talk about your clothes in Spanish!

- To describe the colour of your clothes, place the colour after the item. For example: 'Los pantalones azules' means 'the blue trousers'.
- Remember that 'el' and 'los' are used for masculine items, while 'la' and 'las' are used for feminine items.
- If it is a cold day, you might say 'Llevo un jersey' (I am wearing a jumper).
- If it is a sunny day, you might wear 'una camiseta' (a T-shirt).
- Rosa loves to dress up! She always says 'Me gusta mi ropa' which means 'I like my clothes'.

Did you know? Did you know? In Spain, many people use the word 'ropa' to talk about clothing in general. If you want to say 'I am wearing', you start your sentence with 'Llevo puesto...' followed by the item of clothing!
