

Rosa's Colourful Spanish Assessment

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding and recall of Spanish colour vocabulary and their agreement with nouns.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you. Write your answers clearly in the spaces provided.

Rosa the parrot is flying over a vibrant garden. She spots a bright red flower, a yellow butterfly, and a green leaf. She lands on a brown branch to record the colours in her notebook.

Word bank: rojo (red) · azul (blue) · amarillo (yellow) · verde (green) · naranja (orange) · morado (purple) · rosa (pink) · blanco (white) · negro (black) · marrón (brown)

1. Translate the following colours into Spanish: 1. Red, 2. Blue, 3. Yellow, 4. Green. (4 marks)

2. Rosa sees a white cloud and a black bird. Write these in Spanish. (2 marks)

3. If 'el libro' (the book) is purple, how would you write 'the purple book' in Spanish? (Hint: use 'el libro morado') (2 marks)

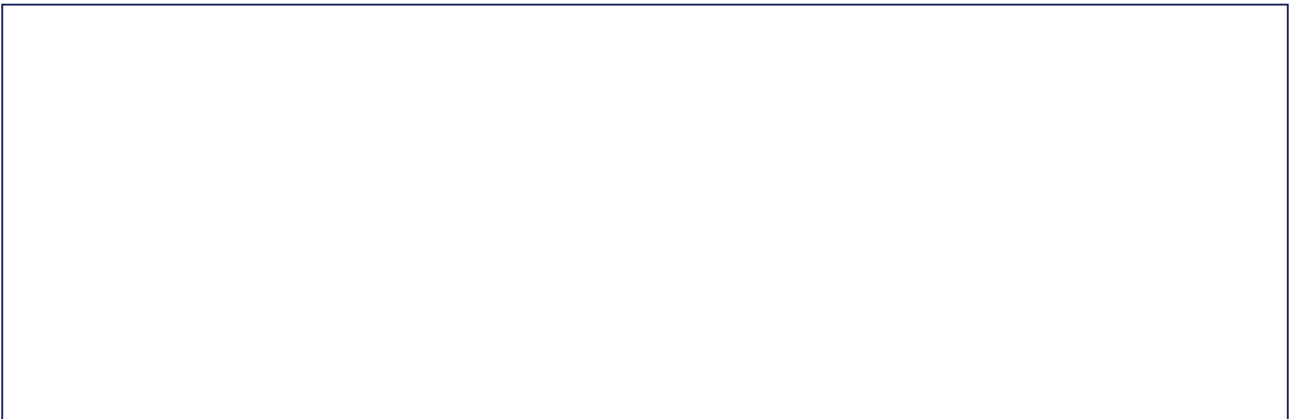
4. Look at the list of colours. Which two colours are often used to describe natural things like the sun and the grass? Explain your answer in a full sentence. (4 marks)

5. Rosa wants to describe her feathers. She has some bright pink and some deep orange feathers. Write a sentence in Spanish describing her feathers. (Example: Mis plumas son...) (4 marks)

6. Imagine you are painting a picture of a park. Describe three items you would paint and state the colour of each in Spanish. (e.g., 'El cielo es azul'). (4 marks)

7. Rosa is writing a poem about a rainbow. Write a short paragraph (3-5 sentences) in English explaining why learning colour names in Spanish is useful when travelling to Spain or visiting a local market. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Rosa the parrot sitting in a tree. Label at least three parts of your drawing with the correct Spanish colour word.
