

¡Los Números! (Numbers with Rosa the Parrot)

Fly into Spanish! Learn your numbers with Rosa the Parrot!

- The number 0 is written as 'cero' in Spanish. Remember to keep the 'c' soft, sounding like an 's' sound in many Spanish-speaking countries.
- Numbers 1 to 5 are: uno, dos, tres, cuatro, and cinco. Practise saying them out loud to get the rhythm of the language.
- The numbers 6 to 10 are: seis, siete, ocho, nueve, and diez. Notice how 'diez' ends with a 'z' sound, which is often pronounced like a soft 'th' in Spain.
- When counting objects, Spanish numbers stay the same regardless of what you are counting, making them very reliable for your maths puzzles!
- Rosa the Parrot suggests using your fingers to help you remember the sequence from uno to diez as you say the words aloud.

Did you know? Did you know? In Spanish, the word for 'eleven' is 'once'. It is pronounced like 'ohn-thay'. Even though it looks like the English word 'once', it doesn't mean the same thing at all! Rosa the Parrot loves to remind everyone that learning a new language is like unlocking a secret code.
