

Rosa's Spanish Number Challenge

Learning objective: To learn and apply Spanish numbers from 1 to 20, and to practise basic mental maths in Spanish.

Join Rosa the parrot as she practises her numbers! Use the word bank to help you complete the tasks below. Remember to write your answers clearly.

Rosa the parrot loves to count the colourful feathers on her wings and the fruit she finds in the trees. Today, she is helping her friends learn how to say numbers in Spanish.

1. Rosa finds 4 mangoes and 3 bananas. How many pieces of fruit does she have in total? Write your answer in Spanish. (2 marks)

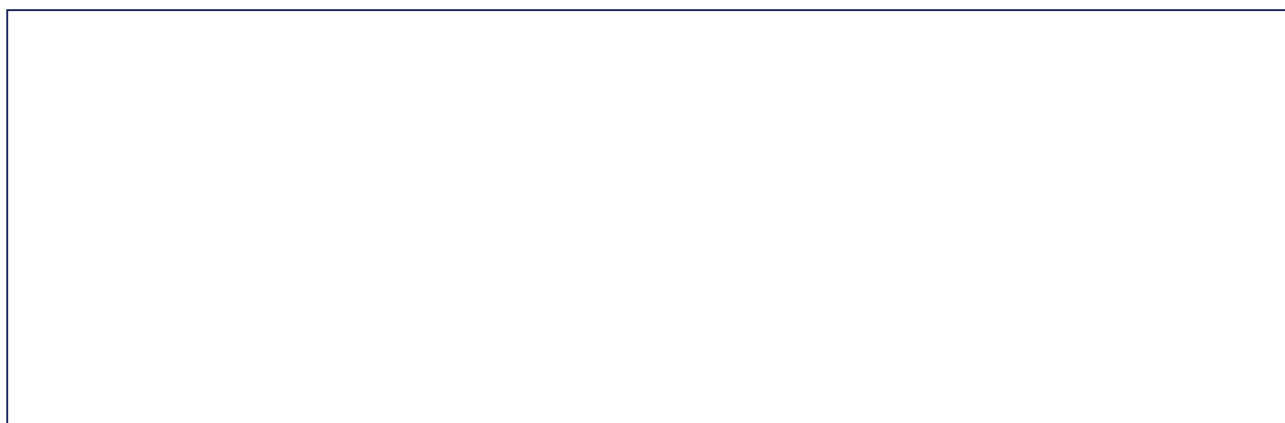
2. If Rosa has 15 nuts and eats 3 of them, how many does she have left? Write the number in Spanish. (2 marks)

3. Complete the sequence: cinco, seis, _____, ocho, nueve. (1 mark)

4. Max the monkey has £12 in his pocket. Write the number 12 in Spanish. (1 mark)

5. Translate these two numbers into Spanish: 16 and 20. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a basket containing exactly 'diez' (10) pieces of fruit. Label the basket with the word 'diez'.



Extension challenge: Pick two numbers between 1 and 20. Write a simple addition sum using those numbers in Spanish (e.g., 'uno + dos = tres').
