

Rosa's Guide to Spanish Opinions

¡Hola! Join Rosa the parrot and learn how to share your favourite things in Spanish!

- To say you like something, start your sentence with 'Me gusta'. Example: Me gusta el fútbol (I like football).
- To express that you love something, use the phrase 'Me encanta'. Example: Me encanta la pizza (I love pizza).
- When you want to say you do not like something, simply add 'No' to the front: 'No me gusta'.
- If you want to add intensity, you can add 'mucho' at the end of your sentence, like 'Me gusta mucho el helado' (I like ice cream a lot).
- Using 'también' allows you to agree with a friend! If they say 'Me gusta el chocolate', you can reply '¡A mí también!' (Me too!).

Did you know? Did you know? In Spanish, we often use the word 'Me' at the start of our opinion phrases. It acts like a mirror, showing that the feeling is directed towards ourselves. Rosa loves to use 'Me encanta' when talking about juicy tropical fruit!
