

Year 4 Spanish Assessment: Los Deportes (Sports)

Learning objective: To demonstrate knowledge of Spanish sports vocabulary, express preferences using 'me gusta' and 'no me gusta', and understand simple sentences about physical activities.

Read each question carefully. Write your answers clearly in English or Spanish as requested. Total marks: 25.

Rosa the parrot is very active! She says: '¡Hola! Me llamo Rosa. Me gusta mucho el fútbol porque es divertido. También me gusta la natación, pero no me gusta el tenis. Mi amigo Leo el león prefiere el baloncesto.'

Word bank: el fútbol (football) · el baloncesto (basketball) · el tenis (tennis) · la natación (swimming) · el ciclismo (cycling) · me gusta (I like) · no me gusta (I do not like) · jugar (to play)

1. Using the passage, list two sports that Rosa likes. (2 marks)

2. Translate the following sentence into English: 'No me gusta el tenis.' (2 marks)

3. Which sport does Leo the lion prefer, according to Rosa? (1 mark)

4. Match the Spanish word to the correct English sport: 1. El ciclismo, 2. La natación. (Write your answers next to the numbers). (2 marks)

5. Explain why it is important to include the word 'jugar' when talking about playing football in Spanish, compared to swimming. (3 marks)

6. Imagine you are talking to Rosa. Write three sentences in Spanish about which sports you like and dislike. Use 'Me gusta...' or 'No me gusta...'. (5 marks)

7. Rosa is teaching a new sport. Describe in English how you would explain the rules of a simple game like 'football' to a friend using only Spanish nouns for the equipment. (5 marks)

8. If a football costs £12.50 and a tennis racket costs £7.25, how much would it cost to buy both? Show your working. (5 marks)
