

Rosa's Spanish Verb Adventure

¡Hola! Let's get moving with Spanish verbs!

- The infinitive is the base form of a verb. In Spanish, these always end in -ar, -er, or -ir.
- To conjugate a verb, we drop the ending and add a new one to match the person, such as 'yo' (I) or 'tú' (you).
- For regular -ar verbs, the 'yo' form always ends in -o (e.g., 'hablar' becomes 'hablo').
- The 'tú' form for regular -ar verbs ends in -as (e.g., 'hablas').
- Changing the verb ending is essential to help your Spanish sound natural and accurate.

Did you know? Did you know? In Spanish, the verb itself often tells you who is doing the action without needing to say the word for 'I', 'you', or 'he'. Because the ending changes, the verb is like a secret code that reveals the subject!
