

Zara's Guide to Sculpture: Shaping the World

Be a 3D explorer! Look around you—everything has a shape, a texture, and a story to tell.

- **Sculpture is a 3D art form, which means it has height, width, and depth, allowing you to walk all the way around it.**
- **Carving is a subtractive process where an artist removes material, like stone or wood, to reveal the hidden shape inside.**
- **Moulding is an additive process where soft materials like clay or wax are pushed and shaped by hand to build up a form.**
- **Assemblage is a creative method where an artist joins different objects together, often using recycled materials, to create something new.**
- **Texture in sculpture is how the surface feels or looks; it can be smooth like polished marble or rough like natural bark.**

Did you know? Did you know? Sculptors have been creating art for thousands of years! Some of the oldest sculptures were tiny figures carved from mammoth ivory and stone, long before people lived in houses or used metal tools.
