Learning objective: To understand and follow instructions in writing and in real-life situations.

Read each question carefully and choose the correct answer.

Word bank: list · sequence · label · measure · count · compare

1. Pip was given a recipe to make a delicious cake. The instructions said to preheat the oven to *350* degrees or *400* degrees Celsius. What is the problem with the instructions? (1 mark)

2. Bea wrote a set of instructions for setting up a bird feeder. 'Step 1: Hang the feeder from a *tree*.' Which word has Bea used to label the action? (1 mark)

3. A friend gave you a list of things to buy at the store: apples, *milk*, bread, and eggs. What does the friend want you to *count*? (1 mark)

4. Nova's science project involved setting up a lab to conduct an experiment. She needed to *measure* the temperature accurately. What might Nova use to measure the temperature? (1 mark)

5. Ellie's recipe for making cookies required her to *compare* the weight of different ingredients. What might Ellie do to compare the weights? (1 mark)

6. Max was given a sequence of numbers to read: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5. What is the next number in the sequence? (1 mark)

7. Finn was creating a map of the local park and needed to *label* the different features. What might Finn write on the map to label the features? (1 mark)

8. A recipe book has a list of ingredients and cooking instructions. True or False: The list and instructions are examples of *sequences*. (1 mark)

9. Leo was writing a set of instructions for his class to follow. He wanted to make sure they were clear and easy to understand. What might Leo do to make his instructions clear? (2 marks)

10. Bea was teaching a class on how to set up a bird feeder. She had the students work *in pairs* and follow the instructions. What might Bea be trying to teach the students? (1 mark)
