5. True or False: A haiku is a type of poem that comes from Italy. (1 mark)

6. What is the name for a single line of poetry? (1 mark)

7. What is a metaphor? A) A word that sounds like a noise B) A poem with no rules C) Saying something IS something else to create a picture D) A word that rhymes with another (1 mark)

8. When the same letter or sound is repeated at the start of words (e.g., 'The shimmering silver sea'), what is this called? (1 mark)

9. True or False: Personification is when we give human qualities to non-human things, like 'the wind whispered'. (1 mark)

10. What do we call words that have the same ending sound, such as 'cat' and 'hat'? (1 mark)
