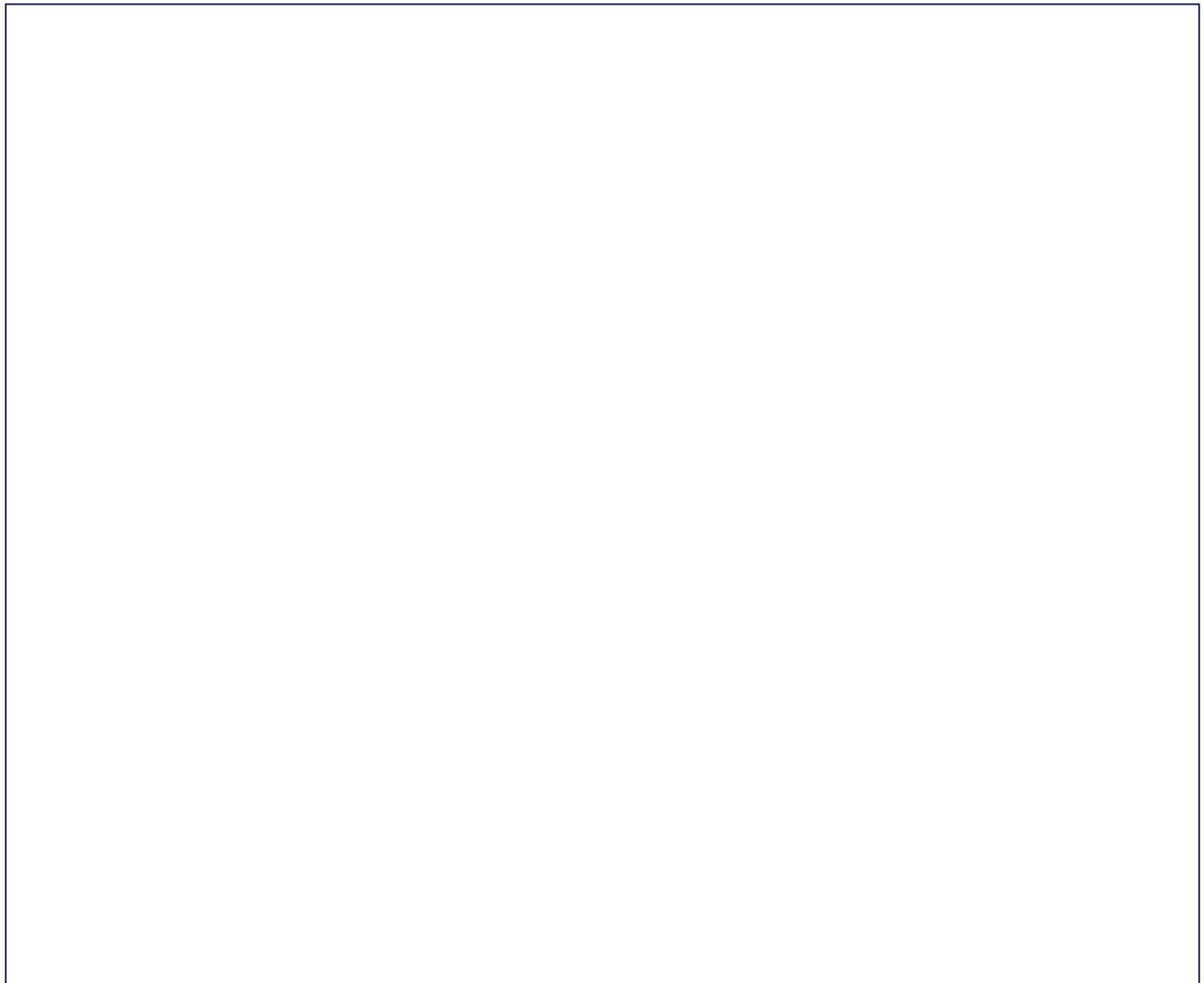


Rosa's French Market Adventure

Learning objective: To identify and use French vocabulary for common items found in a market and practice using price tags in pounds (£).

Rosa the parrot is helping out at a French market today! Read the word bank carefully. Draw the items on the market stall provided below, then label them in French and add a price tag in pounds (£) for each item.

Draw: Create a large, rectangular market stall table in the center of the page. Above the table, draw a striped canopy. On the table, draw the items from the word bank: a shiny apple, a flaky croissant, a bright orange carrot, a slice of cake, a curved banana, and a crusty loaf of bread. Ensure there is space next to each item to write its French label and a small price tag.



Label words: une pomme (apple) · un croissant (croissant) · une carotte (carrot) · un gâteau (cake) · une banane (banana) · du pain (bread)

Steps:

1. Draw a market stall scene featuring at least four items from the word bank. Label each item using the correct French word.
2. Add a price tag to each of your four items using the £ symbol. Example: £1.50.
3. If a customer buys 'une pomme' for 50p and 'un croissant' for £1.20, how much do they spend in total?

4. Which item from your list would you choose to buy for a snack? Write the French name and the price.
5. Rosa wants to buy 'du pain'. If it costs £1.80 and she pays with a £2.00 coin, how much change should she receive?
