- Florence Nightingale was born in 1820 and decided to become a nurse, even though it was not considered a suitable career for a wealthy woman at the time.
- During the Crimean War in 1854, she travelled to the Barrack Hospital in Scutari to care for wounded soldiers.
- She noticed that soldiers were dying from poor conditions, so she insisted on cleaning the hospital floors and washing the bedding regularly.
- Florence earned her famous nickname, 'The Lady with the Lamp', because she walked the hospital wards at night to check on the soldiers, carrying a small lantern.
- After the war, she founded the Nightingale Training School for nurses, which changed how hospitals were run all over the world.

Did you know? Did you know? Florence Nightingale was a brilliant mathematician! She used charts and graphs to prove that better hospital hygiene could save lives, and she was the first woman to be elected to the Royal Statistical Society.
