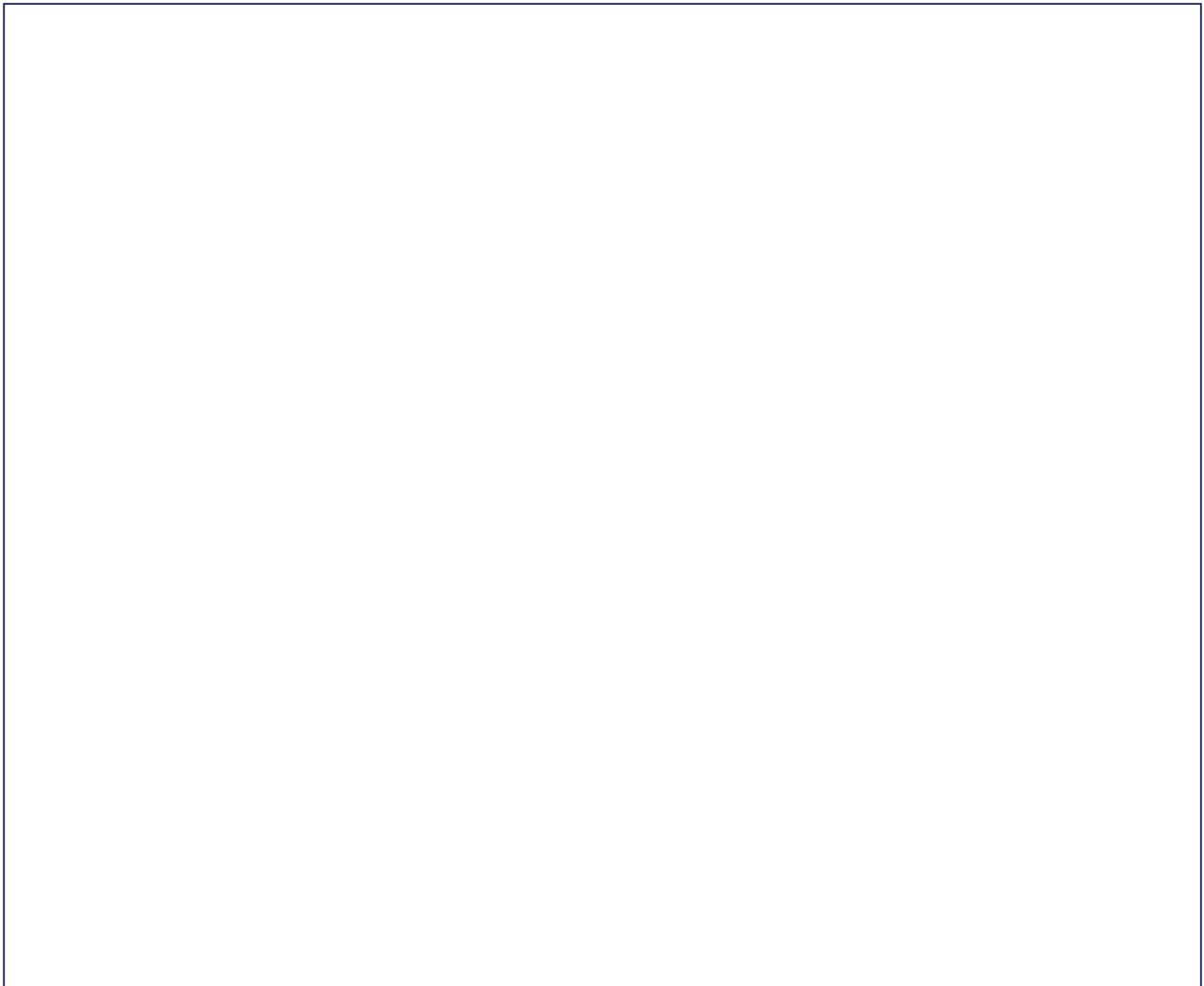


# Ellie's Tudor Discovery Sketchbook

*Learning objective: To identify and illustrate key features of Tudor fashion and daily life in the 16th century.*

Follow the steps below to complete your Tudor scene. Use your knowledge of the Tudor period to add accurate details to your drawing.

**Draw: Draw a large Tudor scene. In the center, draw a person wearing 16th-century clothing, including a large ruff around their neck and a doublet. In the background, draw a house with black wooden beams and white plaster walls (timber-framed). In the corner, include a Tudor Rose symbol. Use fine lines to show detail in the fabric and the wooden beams.**



*Label words: Ruff · Doublet · Tudor Rose · Timber-framed · Breeches · Farthingale*

## Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a Tudor house in the background. What feature makes it look like a Tudor building rather than a modern one?
2. Step 2: Draw a Tudor person. Label their 'ruff' and 'doublet' using the word bank.
3. Step 3: What symbol would you draw on the person's clothing to show their loyalty to the Tudor family?
4. Step 4: Draw a simple Tudor garden. Why were gardens important for food and medicine during this time?
5. Step 5: Write one sentence explaining why rich Tudor clothes were often made of expensive materials like

silk or velvet.
