1. Why do you think it is important for us to learn about the achievements of Black pioneers during Black History Month? (2 marks)

2. Max the monkey is looking at a timeline of history. If you could choose one person who has made a positive change in the world, who would it be and what did they do? (2 marks)

3. Explain what the word 'equality' means to you and how we can show this value in our school classroom. (2 marks)

4. If you were to design a celebration for Black History Month at school, what is one activity you would include to help your classmates learn something new? (2 marks)

5. Think about a 'legacy'. How can the actions we take today help make the future better for other children? (2 marks)
