

Introduction to Christianity

Learning objective: To identify and understand key beliefs, symbols, and practices within the Christian faith.

Read the term or question on the front of the card, try to remember the answer, and then flip the card to check if you are correct. Max the monkey can help you keep track of how many you get right!

What is the holy book for Christians?

The Bible: The sacred text containing the Old and New Testaments.

What is the most common symbol of Christianity?

The Cross: A symbol that reminds Christians of the death and resurrection of Jesus.

What is a 'Parable'?

Parable: A short story told by Jesus that teaches a lesson about how to live a good life.

What is a church?

Church: A building where Christians go to worship God and gather as a community.

What is prayer?

Prayer: A way for Christians to communicate with God, whether by asking for help or giving thanks.

Who is the central figure of the Christian faith?

Jesus: Christians believe Jesus is the Son of God and the Saviour of humanity.

What is the Trinity?

The Trinity: The belief that God exists in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

What is the name of the first part of the Bible?

The Old Testament: The section that contains the stories and laws from before the birth of Jesus.

What happens during Christmas for Christians?

Christmas: The celebration of the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem.

What is Easter the celebration of?

Easter: The celebration of the resurrection of Jesus from the dead.

What does a priest or minister do in a church?

A leader: They lead the worship service, perform baptisms, and support the congregation.

What is a hymn?

Hymn: A religious song of praise sung during a Christian service.
