1. Which Eid festival marks the end of the month of fasting during Ramadan? (1 mark)

2. What is the name of the festival that commemorates the story of Ibrahim (Abraham) and his willingness to obey God? (1 mark)

3. Muslims often give money to the poor before the Eid prayer. What is this act of obligatory charity called? (1 mark)

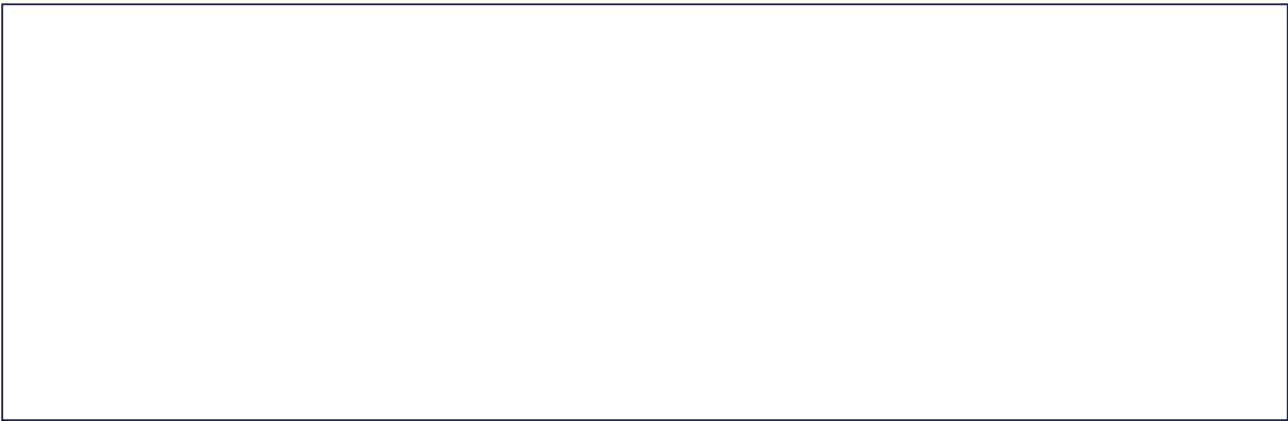
4. Describe two things a Muslim family might do to prepare their home or themselves for an Eid celebration. (2 marks)

5. Why is the concept of 'community' important during the Eid celebrations? Give two reasons. (4 marks)

6. Explain the difference between Eid al-Fitr and Eid al-Adha. How are they different in what they celebrate? (6 marks)

7. Imagine you are inviting a friend to an Eid celebration. Write a short paragraph explaining why this day is special, what values are being shown (such as kindness or generosity), and what the atmosphere is like. (10 marks)
