

Rosa's Family Tree Challenge

Learning objective: To identify and use Spanish vocabulary for family members to complete a family tree diagram.

Rosa the parrot has been busy learning about her friends' families! Use the words from the word bank to correctly label the people on the family tree below. Once you have labelled them, answer the questions to show how well you know your Spanish family vocabulary.

Word bank: abuelo · abuela · padre · madre · hermano · hermana · tío · tía

1. If you wanted to say 'my mother', which two words would you use in Spanish? (2 marks)

2. Rosa's friend says, 'Mi hermano es alto.' Translate this sentence into English. (2 marks)

3. What is the difference between 'tío' and 'tía'? Explain how you know who is who. (2 marks)

4. Fill in the blank: The Spanish word for grandfather is _____. (1 mark)

5. If Max the monkey has two sisters, what would he call them in Spanish? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a large tree with branches. On each branch, draw a picture representing a family member (like a grandfather or a sister) and write the correct Spanish label next to each character you have drawn.



Extension challenge: Write three simple sentences in Spanish describing your own family using the structure 'Mi [family member] se llama [name].' For example: 'Mi madre se llama Sarah.'
