

Rosa's Market Adventure: Spanish Shopping Assessment

Learning objective: To identify key vocabulary related to shops and food, express preferences using 'me gusta/no me gusta', and calculate simple prices in Spanish.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you with your spellings. Write your answers clearly in the spaces provided.

Rosa the parrot is visiting the local market. She wants to buy some fresh bread for her breakfast and a red apple for her snack. She sees a sign that says the bread costs £2 and the apple costs £1. She feels very happy because she loves shopping at the market.

Word bank: la panadería (bakery) · la frutería (greengrocer) · el mercado (market) · ¿Cuánto cuesta? · cuesta... · la manzana (apple) · el pan (bread) · me gusta (I like) · no me gusta (I do not like)

1. Using the passage, translate these two items into Spanish: 'The bread' and 'The apple'. (2 marks)

2. Rosa wants to ask the shopkeeper how much the apple costs. Write the Spanish phrase she should use. (2 marks)

3. If the bread costs £2 and the apple costs £1, what is the total cost in pounds? Write your answer in a full sentence in Spanish: 'Cuesta...'. (3 marks)

4. Name the two shops Rosa might visit to buy bread and fruit. Use the Spanish terms from the word bank. (4 marks)

5. Rosa enjoys the market. Write two sentences in Spanish: one explaining what she likes (me gusta) and one explaining what she does not like (no me gusta). (4 marks)

6. Extended Writing: Imagine you are at the market with Rosa. Write a short dialogue (5-6 sentences) between you and a shopkeeper. You must ask for an item, ask the price, and say thank you. (5 marks)

7. Explain why it is important to know the currency symbol (£) when shopping in different countries. How does it help us understand the cost? (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a small market stall with a sign showing the prices of two items in pounds (£). Label the items using the Spanish words from the word bank.
