

¡Qué tiempo hace! - Weather in Spanish

Join Rosa the parrot on a sunny adventure to learn how to talk about the weather in Spanish!

- If you look out the window and see a big yellow sun, you can say: 'Hace sol'.
- To ask a friend about the weather, use the phrase: '¿Qué tiempo hace?'.
- When you need your umbrella because water is falling from the sky, it is: 'Llueve'.
- When you need a warm coat and gloves because the temperature is low, it is: 'Hace frío'.
- If the trees are swaying because the air is moving quickly, it is: 'Hace viento'.
- When the ground turns white and soft flakes fall from the sky, it is: 'Nieva'.

Did you know? Did you know? Spanish is spoken in many different countries across the world, which means the weather can change from 'hace frío' (it is cold) in the snowy mountains of Spain to 'hace calor' (it is hot) on the beautiful beaches of Mexico or Colombia!
