

Zara's Festive Art Workshop: Creative Christmas

Unleash your inner artist and bring the magic of the season to life through patterns and colour!

- **Symmetry is a key element in festive art. Try drawing a snowflake by creating a pattern that is identical on both sides of a central line.**
- **Using complementary colours, such as red and green, creates high contrast and makes your festive artwork stand out to the viewer.**
- **Texture can be added to your drawings by using different mark-making techniques, such as cross-hatching or stippling, to represent snow or pine needles.**
- **Many historical decorations were handmade using natural materials like dried oranges, cinnamon sticks, and holly, which are great inspirations for still-life sketches.**
- **When designing a card, consider the 'rule of thirds' to balance your composition and ensure your focal point is clear and engaging.**

Did you know? Did you know? The tradition of the Christmas cracker was invented in 1847 by Tom Smith, a sweet-maker who was inspired by the 'crack' of a log burning in a fireplace and decided to wrap his sweets in paper that pulled apart with a bang!
