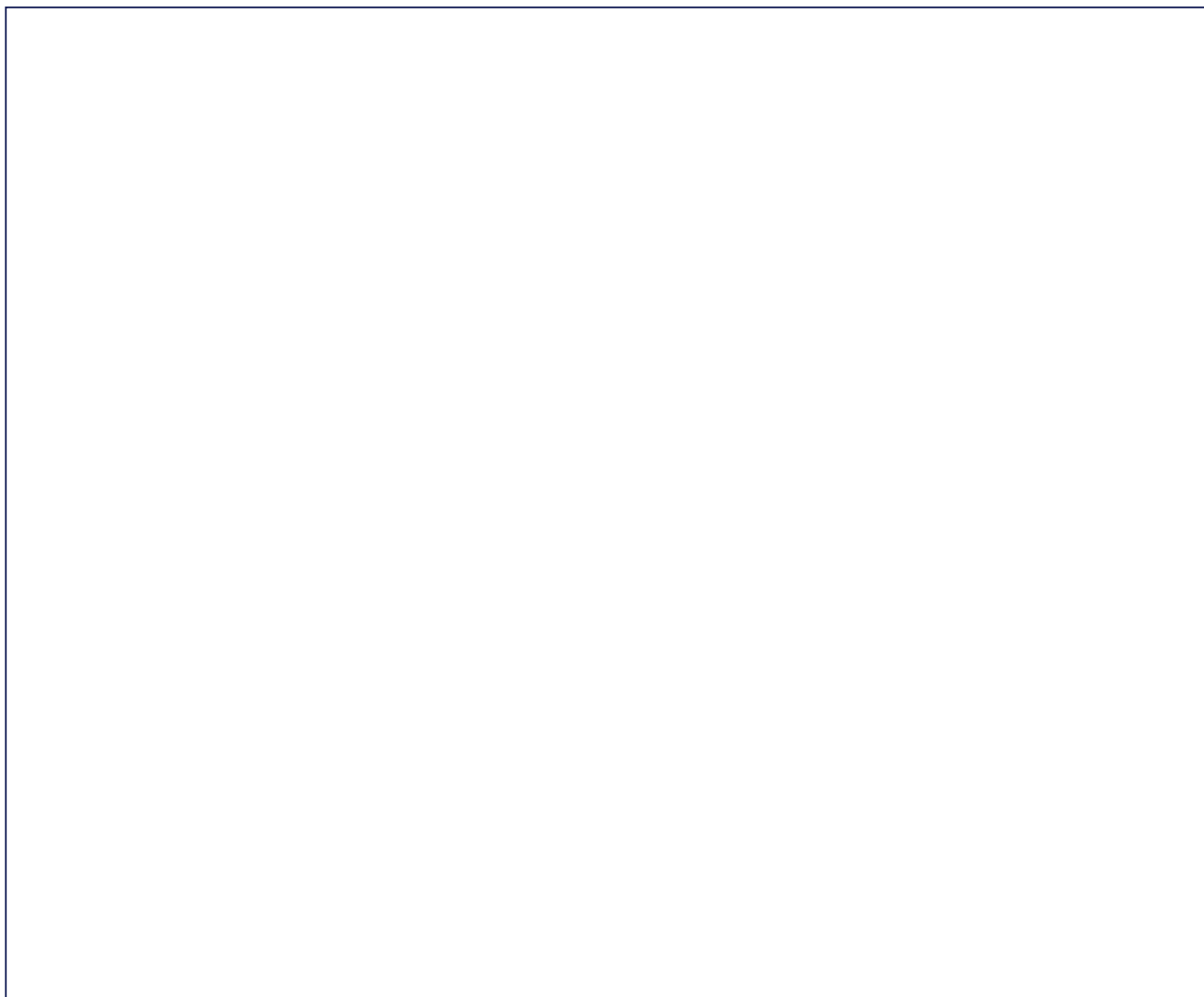


Kit's Digital Shield: Designing Your E-Safety Fortress

Learning objective: To identify and illustrate key strategies for staying safe online, including password security, privacy settings, and respectful digital communication.

Use the drawing space below to create a 'Digital Shield'. Think of this as a protective barrier that keeps your personal information safe while you explore the internet. Use the word bank to label the different parts of your shield.

Draw: Draw a large, sturdy shield in the centre of the page. Inside the shield, sketch icons representing security: a padlock for passwords, a gear for settings, and a heart for kind communication. Outside the shield, add a friendly character like Kit the fox, and include speech bubbles showing positive, safe online behaviours.



Label words: Secure Password · Private Information · Respectful · Trusted Adult · Settings · Digital Footprint

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large shield in the centre of the page. Inside the shield, draw three symbols that represent how you keep your online accounts safe (e.g., a lock for passwords).
2. Step 2: Label the 'Private Information' area of your shield. List two examples of information you should never share online.
3. Step 3: Outside the shield, draw a character (like Kit the fox) holding a sign. What is one piece of advice

Kit should give about being 'Respectful' in a chat room?

4. Explain why it is important to tell a 'Trusted Adult' if you see something online that makes you feel uncomfortable or worried.
5. Compare and contrast: How is your 'Digital Footprint' similar to physical footprints you leave in the sand at the beach?
6. Justify your answer: Why is using a 'Secure Password'—one that is long and includes symbols—more effective than using your pet's name or your birthday?
