

Kit's Digital Safety Map

Learning objective: To understand how to stay safe online by identifying personal information and recognising the importance of privacy settings.

Kit the fox is building a digital shield to protect his online world. Use the drawing prompt below to illustrate how you keep your own digital footprint safe. Use the word bank to label your diagram.

Draw: Draw a large, glowing shield in the centre of your page. Inside the shield, draw yourself or an avatar doing something safe online, like playing a creative game or reading an e-book. Outside the shield, draw icons representing 'risks' that are blocked by your safety measures. Use bright colours for the shield and darker, muted colours for the blocked risks. Include speech bubbles for Kit the fox giving safety advice.

Steps:

1. Explain why it is important to keep your home address and school name private when using the internet.
2. What should you do if you see something online that makes you feel worried or uncomfortable?
3. Step 1: Draw a 'Digital Shield' around your main character. Inside the shield, draw three things that are safe to share online (e.g., a drawing of a hobby).

4. Step 2: Label the outside of your shield with at least three examples of 'Personal Data' that should never be shared.
5. List two features of a strong, secure password that would be difficult for someone else to guess.
