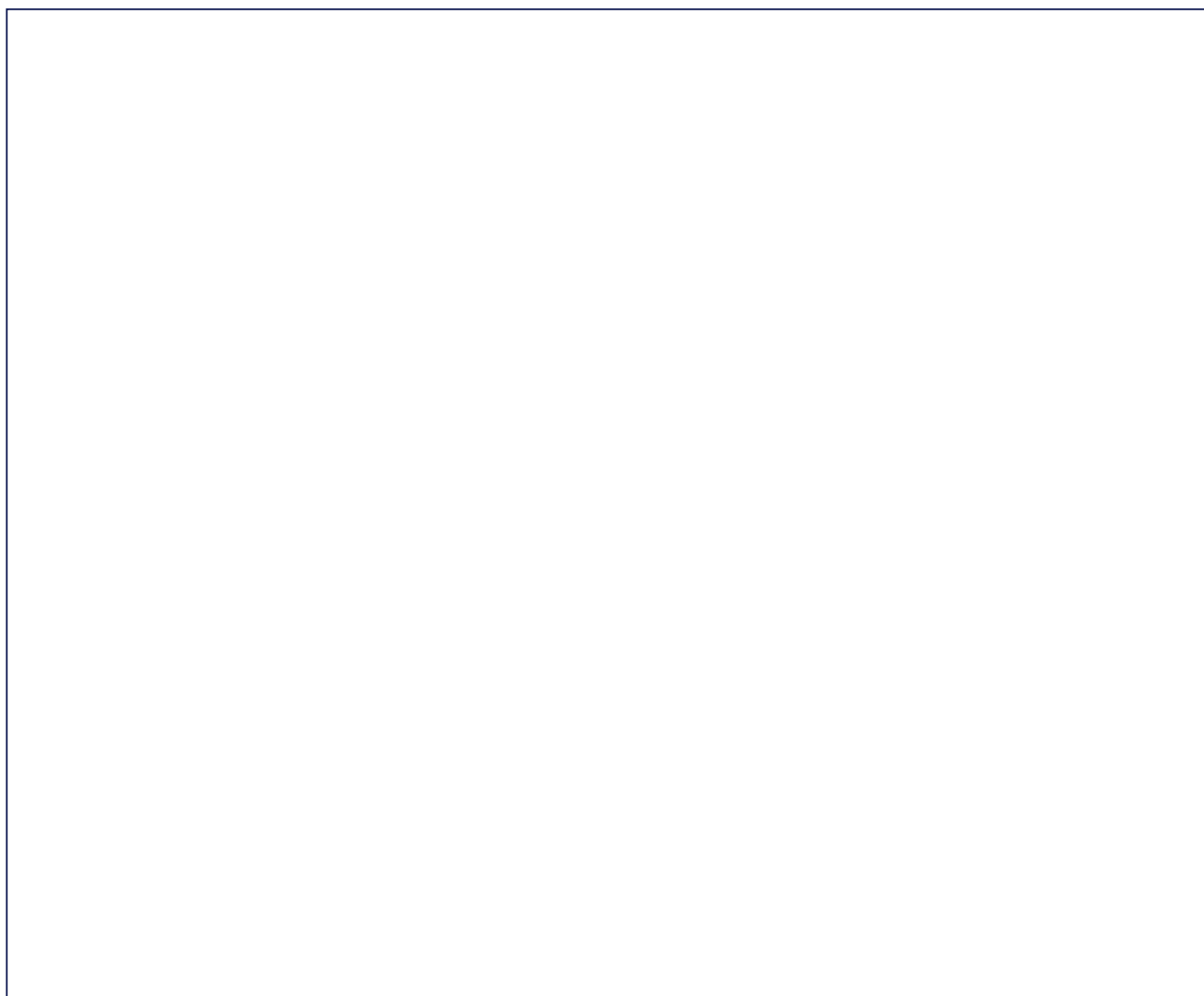


Kit's Internet Safety Shield

Learning objective: To identify and illustrate key strategies for staying safe online, including protecting personal information and understanding digital footprints.

Kit the fox is building a digital shield to protect his online adventures. Use the space below to draw Kit's shield, including symbols for safety rules you have learned in Computing. Use the word bank to label your design.

Draw: Create a clear, colourful scene featuring Kit the fox standing next to a large, decorative shield. The style should be clean and instructional, similar to a poster. Ensure there is plenty of white space around the shield for students to add labels from the word bank and their own drawings of online safety icons.



Label words: Password · Private information · Digital footprint · Trusted adult · Privacy settings · Cyberbullying

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large shield in the centre of your page. Inside the shield, draw a padlock to represent a strong password.
2. Step 2: Around the edge of your shield, draw three icons that represent 'Private Information' that you should never share online (e.g., address, school name). Label these clearly.

3. Step 3: Outside the shield, draw a 'Trusted Adult' character. Explain why this person is important if you feel uncomfortable online.
4. Step 4: Label the area beneath your shield as your 'Digital Footprint'. Draw small footprints leading away from the shield to show how your online actions stay behind.
5. Step 5: Write one sentence explaining what you should do if you receive a message from someone you do not know.
