

Adjective Adventures with Pip the Caterpillar

Learning objective: To identify and use adjectives to describe nouns, helping to make our writing more exciting.

Read the front of each flashcard to find a noun. Flip the card (mentally) to see an example of an adjective that describes it. Can you think of your own adjective for each one?

A juicy apple

The word 'juicy' is an adjective because it describes what the apple is like.

A tiny ladybird

The word 'tiny' is an adjective because it describes the size of the ladybird.

A soft blanket

The word 'soft' is an adjective because it tells us how the blanket feels.

A bright star

The word 'bright' is an adjective because it describes how the star looks.

A loud monkey

The word 'loud' is an adjective because it describes the sound the monkey makes.

A green leaf

The word 'green' is an adjective because it describes the colour of the leaf.

A happy elephant

The word 'happy' is an adjective because it describes how the elephant is feeling.

A sharp pencil

The word 'sharp' is an adjective because it describes the shape and tip of the pencil.

A cold drink

The word 'cold' is an adjective because it describes the temperature of the drink.

A fast dolphin

The word 'fast' is an adjective because it describes how the dolphin moves.

A bumpy stone

The word 'bumpy' is an adjective because it describes the texture of the stone.

A brave lion

The word 'brave' is an adjective because it describes the personality of the lion.
