Learning objective: To identify and use effective adjectives to enhance descriptive writing.

Read the text carefully and answer the questions below. Ensure you use full sentences and refer back to the text to support your answers.

1. Find two adjectives in the text used to describe the sculpture. (2 marks) (2 marks)

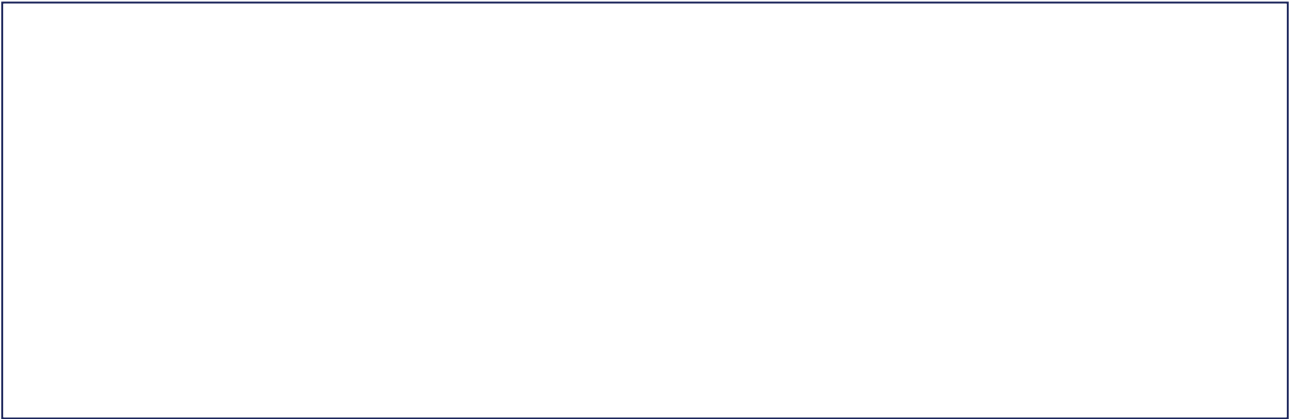
2. What are the two colours mentioned that describe the painting of the stormy sea? (2 marks) (2 marks)

5. Do you think Zara is a successful artist? Justify your answer using your own opinion and evidence from the passage. (3 marks) (3 marks)
