

Adverb Adventure with Max the Monkey

Learning objective: To identify and use adverbs to describe how, when, or where an action is performed.

What is an adverb?

An adverb is a word that describes a verb, telling us more about how, when, or where an action happens.

Max the monkey climbed the tree quickly. Which word is the adverb?

Quickly

Many adverbs end with which two letters?

-ly

Fill in the blank: The lion roared _____. (Use an adverb)

Loudly (or another suitable adverb)

Does an adverb describe a noun or a verb?

A verb

Pip read his book yesterday. Which word is the adverb of time (when)?

Yesterday

Zara painted the pattern carefully. What question does 'carefully' answer?

How (How did she paint?)

Give an example of an adverb of place (where).

Here, there, or everywhere

Change the adjective 'slow' into an adverb.

Slowly

Nova flew upwards. Which word is the adverb of place?

Upwards

True or False: 'The blue elephant' contains an adverb.

False (Blue describes the noun elephant, so it is an adjective)

Finn swam today. Which word is the adverb?

Today
