

Adventures with Adverbs: Mastering Modification

Learning objective: To identify, select, and use adverbs to add detail and precision to our writing.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you select the most effective adverbs to describe how, where, or when an action takes place. Remember that adverbs often describe verbs, but they can also modify adjectives.

Max the monkey is busy solving maths puzzles, while Nova the owl observes the stars from her favourite branch.

Word bank: cautiously · frequently · inquisitively · nearby · silently · yesterday · energetically · remarkably

1. Max the monkey climbed the tree _____ to reach his maths notes. Choose the most suitable adverb from the word bank and explain why it fits the context better than 'quickly'. (2 marks)

2. Rewrite this sentence adding an adverb to modify the verb: 'The lion roared.' (1 mark)

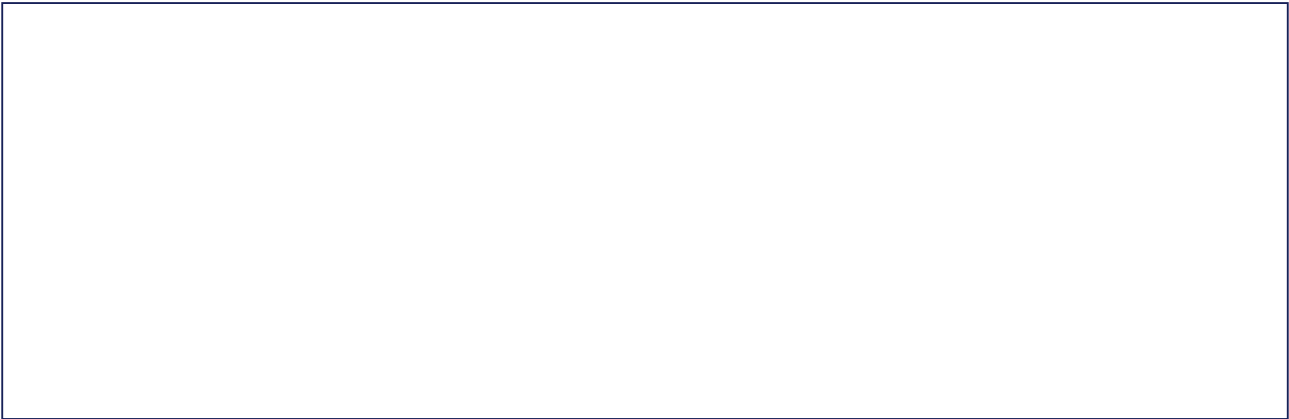
3. Look at the sentence: 'Nova looked at the constellations inquisitively.' Identify the verb and the adverb. What does the adverb tell us about Nova's action? (2 marks)

4. Compare these two sentences: 'Pip walked.' and 'Pip walked cautiously.' Why does the second sentence provide a better image for the reader? Justify your answer. (2 marks)

5. Select two adverbs from the word bank that describe 'when' something happens. Use them in two original sentences about Bea the bee's busy day. (2 marks)

6. What might happen to the meaning of a sentence if you moved the adverb to a different position? Give an example using the adverb 'silently'. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Kit the fox conducting a clever experiment in his laboratory. Label your drawing with three different adverbs that describe how he is moving or working.



Extension challenge: Write a short paragraph (4-6 sentences) describing an adventurous journey taken by Zara the zebra. You must include at least one adverb for every verb you use. Challenge yourself to use adverbs that describe the degree of an action, such as 'extremely' or 'partially'.
