

Bonfire Night Fun with Pip the Caterpillar

Learning objective: To use descriptive language and adjectives to write about Bonfire Night whilst practising sentence structure.

Read the questions carefully and use the word bank to help you write your answers. Remember to use a capital letter at the start of your sentence and a full stop at the end.

Word bank: bright · loud · sparkling · colourful · warm · fizz · bang · night · sky

1. Pip the caterpillar is watching the fireworks. Can you write a sentence describing what the fireworks look like in the night sky? (2 marks)

2. Fireworks make very loud noises. Can you write two words from the word bank that describe the sounds they make? (2 marks)

3. Bonfires are very warm. Why do you think people like to stand near a bonfire on a cold November night? (2 marks)

4. If you were buying a sparkler at a stall, it would cost £1. If you had a £2 coin, how much change would you get back? (2 marks)

5. Think of a word to describe how you feel when you see a beautiful firework display. Write it in a full sentence. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of a bright, colourful firework display above a warm, glowing bonfire. Make sure to draw Pip the caterpillar watching safely from a distance!



Extension challenge: Write a short poem about Bonfire Night. Use your best handwriting and try to include at least three rhyming words.
