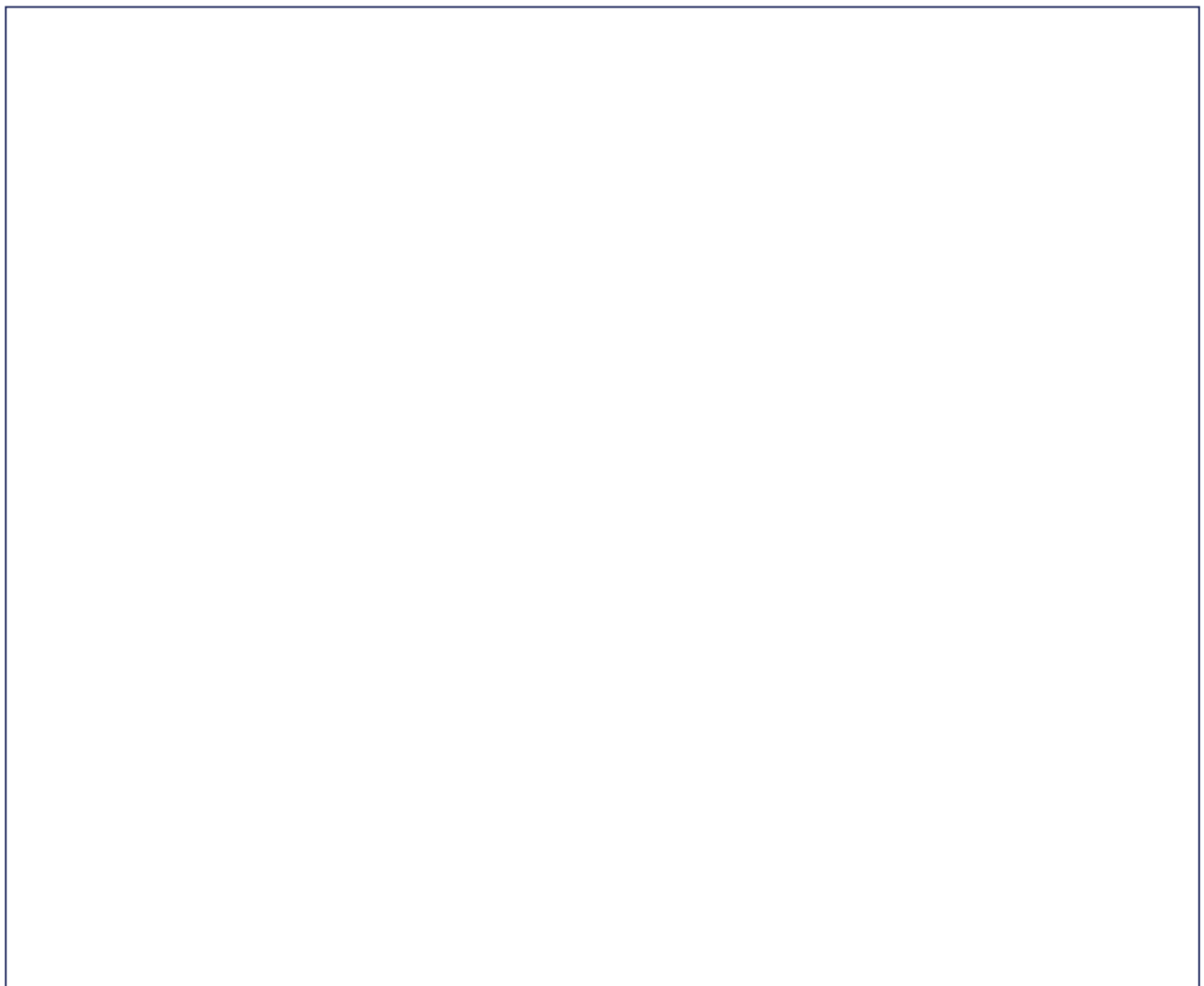


Bonfire Night Illustration Challenge

Learning objective: To use descriptive vocabulary and visual representation to capture the sights, sounds, and atmosphere of Bonfire Night, following the Australian Curriculum (ACARA) requirements for descriptive writing and art.

Follow the drawing prompt below to create a detailed scene of a Bonfire Night celebration. Use the word bank to label at least four elements of your drawing with descriptive adjectives to enhance your work.

Draw: Draw a nighttime garden scene featuring a large, safe bonfire in the centre. Above the bonfire, draw a night sky filled with colourful, exploding fireworks. Include Nova the barn owl perched on a nearby branch, watching the display with wide, curious eyes. Use different drawing techniques to show the difference between the warm, flickering glow of the fire on the ground and the bright, sharp bursts of light in the sky. Ensure your drawing includes shadows cast by the fire and clear safety boundaries for the onlookers.



Label words: Resplendent · Cascading · Cacophony · Glimmering · Crackling · Illuminated · Vibrant · Atmospheric

Steps:

1. Choose one word from the word bank that describes the sound of the fireworks and explain why you chose it.

2. Write a short, powerful sentence to describe the fire in the centre of your drawing using a metaphor.
3. Label the sky area of your drawing with a noun phrase that describes the colours of the fireworks.
4. Identify one safety feature you have included in your drawing (e.g., a barrier or distance) and explain its importance.
5. How does the light from the bonfire change the colours of the people standing nearby? Describe this using the word 'reflected'.
